Scientific Headlines 2022

From groundbreaking discoveries in fields such as astrophysics and genetics, to significant advances in technology and medicine, the year 2022 has been a wealth of scientific progress.

Here's a look back at some of the biggest scientific headlines of 2022.

10 January: A heart from a genetically modified pig is transplanted into a human being for the first time.

20 January: UNESCO announces a major new 3km coral reef discovered off the coast of Tahiti, Pacific Ocean.

24 January: The James Webb Space Telescope arrives at its destination.

26 January: Laparoscopic surgery is performed entirely by a robot for the first time.

8 February: SIBELIUS DARK marks the largest, most accurate computer simulation of the Universe.

11 February: Astronomers discover the largest galaxy, Alcyoneus.

5 March: Long lost shipwreck, Endurance is found.

30 March: Farthest star ever recorded, Earendel, is discovered 12.9 billion light years away.

1 April: Biochemists finish sequencing the human genome.

6 April: The first known dinosaur fossil linked to the day of the Chicxulub meteor impact is discovered in Tanis, North Dakota.

26 April: Scientists detect chemicals similar to those found in DNA and RNA in several meteorites from space.

5 May: The monthly average CO₂ level in Earth's atmosphere exceeds 420ppm for the first time in recorded history

6 May: Scientists report the discovery of 830 million year old microorganisms within salt rock that may still be alive.

30 May: Oak Ridge National Laboratory announces Frontier – the world's first exascale supercomputer.

2 June: Scientists 3D print an ear with a patient's own cells

21 June: A well preserved baby woolly mammoth is found

23 June: The largest known bacterium *T. magnifica* is discovered. It averages 10mm in length

12 July: The first images from the James Webb Space Telescope are released.

28 July: DeepMind announces its AlphaFold program has uncovered the structures of all proteins known to science (200+million).

3 August: Scientists invent an organ perfusion system that can restore multiple vital organs after death.

11 August: A cornea made from pig's skin is shown to restore vision to blind people.

24 August: The dugong, marine mammal is declared extinct in China.

1 September: The James Webb Space Telescope shares its first images of an exoplanet.

6 September: The US Department of Agriculture approves a new, genetically modified purple tomato.

26 September: Jupiter makes its closest approach to Earth since 1963.

1 October: A new simulation by NASA finds that the Moon likely formed within a matter of hours – not days.

3 October: Nobel Prize in Medicine is awarded to Svante Paabo for discoveries involving genomes of extinct hominins.

4 October: Nobel Prize in Physics is awarded to A Aspect, J F Clauser, and A Zellinger for their contribution to quantum physics.

5 October: Nobel Prize in Chemistry is awarded to C.R. Bertozzi, Morten Meldal and K B Sharpless for their work in click/bio-orthogonal chemistry

7 October: A paper details how supercontinent Amasia may form within 300 million years.

31 October: Twins are born from a 30 year old embryo, setting a new record for longest frozen embryos that resulted in live birth.

16 November: NASA conducts Artemis 1, the first uncrewed flight of its Space Launch Systems, the largest rocket in history.

21 November: After 140 years, the black-naped pheasant pigeon is seen again in Papua Guinea.

5 December: Construction begins on the Square Kilometer Array, the largest telescope in history.

7 December: The oldest sample of DNA was found in Greenland, reported to be 2 million years old.

28 December: The first organism that eats viruses, called a virovore, is discovered.

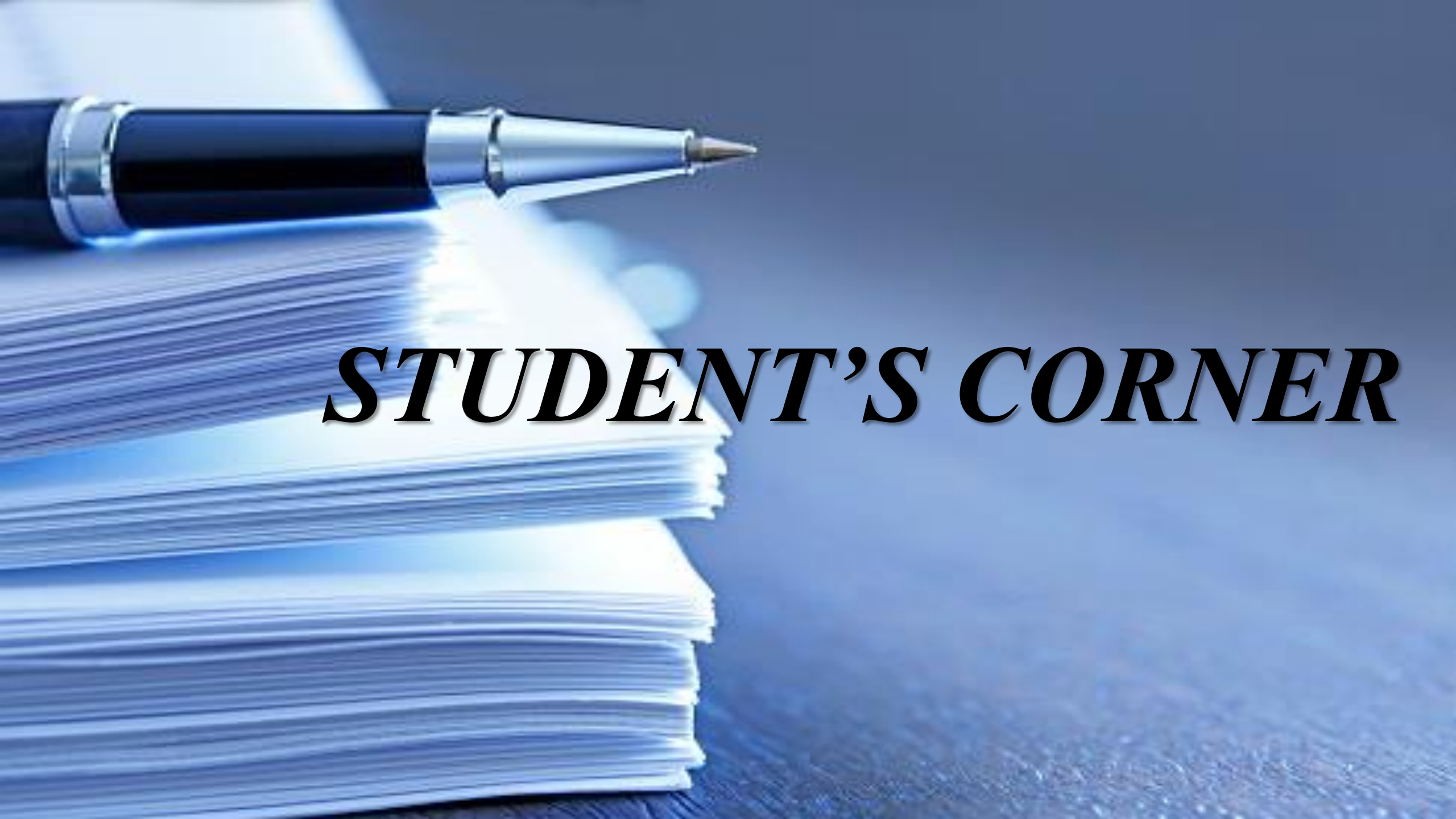

Yes, this was written by an Artificial Intelligence (AI) - based program called ChatGPT. This program is developed by a company named OpenAI and was first released on November 30, 2022. Since then it has become the new buzzword in the technology field. One of the key features of ChatGPT is its ability to generate replies to questions, which sounds very much like answered by a human. This makes it useful for a wide variety of applications, such as creating chatbots - (coined from the term "chat robot") for customer service, generating answers to questions in online forums, or even creating custom-made content for social media posts.


However, ChatGPT is seen as a “scary good”. Despite all the mind-blowing capabilities, ChatGPT had been banned from schools and universities in New York as it turned out that some students used this technology to write essays and scientific papers. Forbes Magazine has predicted that in the next decade, one billion jobs will be taken over by AI, possibly putting the livelihoods of 375 billion humans at risk.

ChatGPT may not always be correct. The developer of ChatGPT, OpenAI had also admitted that ChatGPT may produce answers that sound reasonable but are actually incorrect or nonsensical. So in essence even though it can perform wonderful jobs, it is not all-powerful.

In conclusion, ChatGPT is a powerful language model that has the ability to generate human-like text. It has a wide range of applications in areas such as natural language processing, machine learning and language understanding. However, it is important to remember that ChatGPT is not unfailing and sometimes produces inaccurate or senseless answers. 
I asked ChatGPT to write a poem about our school. I am sharing the poem here.

Fuel from recyclables

Plastic was seen a wonder material when it was first introduced in the 1930s Now we are trying to replace it with other biodegradable materials. What can we do with existing single use plastics like polyethylene. Plastic or polymer is made from petroleum which means we can use it as Fuel . Plastic is flammable but it can release toxic gases while burning .Now comes the question ,how can we use it as fuel? The answer is yes! we can, with the plastic to fuel conversion technology also called pyrolysis technology, which can turn plastic waste into fuel oil and carbon black without pollution. In this technology single use plastics are first collected ,cleaned and transferred into a reactor where it is heated up to a temperature of 450c at this point the plastic inside evaporates and then it condenses into a liquid called plastic fuel which resembles diesel. This process does not cause pollution as it happens in vacuum .The gas released is also flammable and can be used to heat up the reactor. Plastic fuel can be used as an alternative to fossil fuel. Plastic to fuel conversion is a fairly simple process it is not recommended to attempt this conversion process at home as DIY reactors have a high chance of explosion. The conversion process is performed by professionals like polymer and chemical engineers in a well equipped and safe facility.

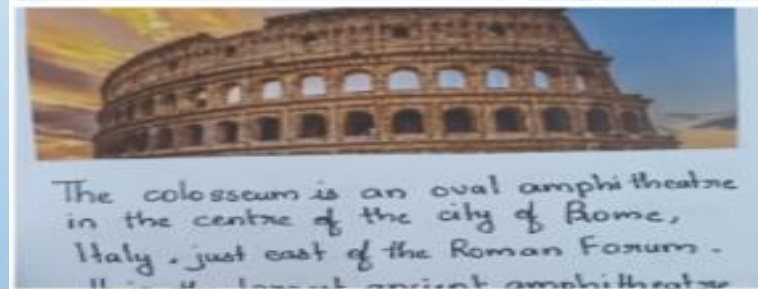
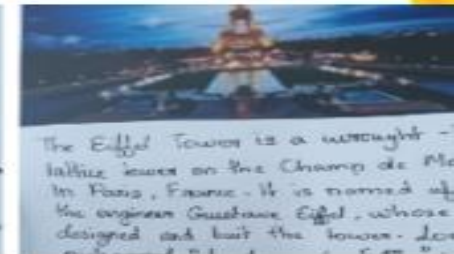
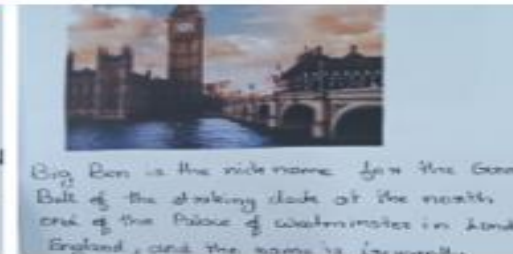
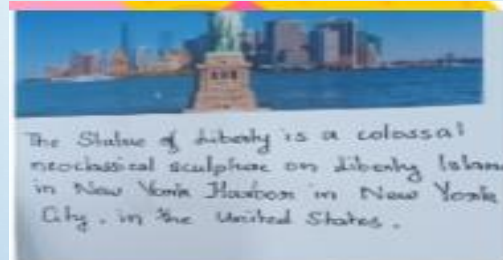
WORLD TOURISM DAY

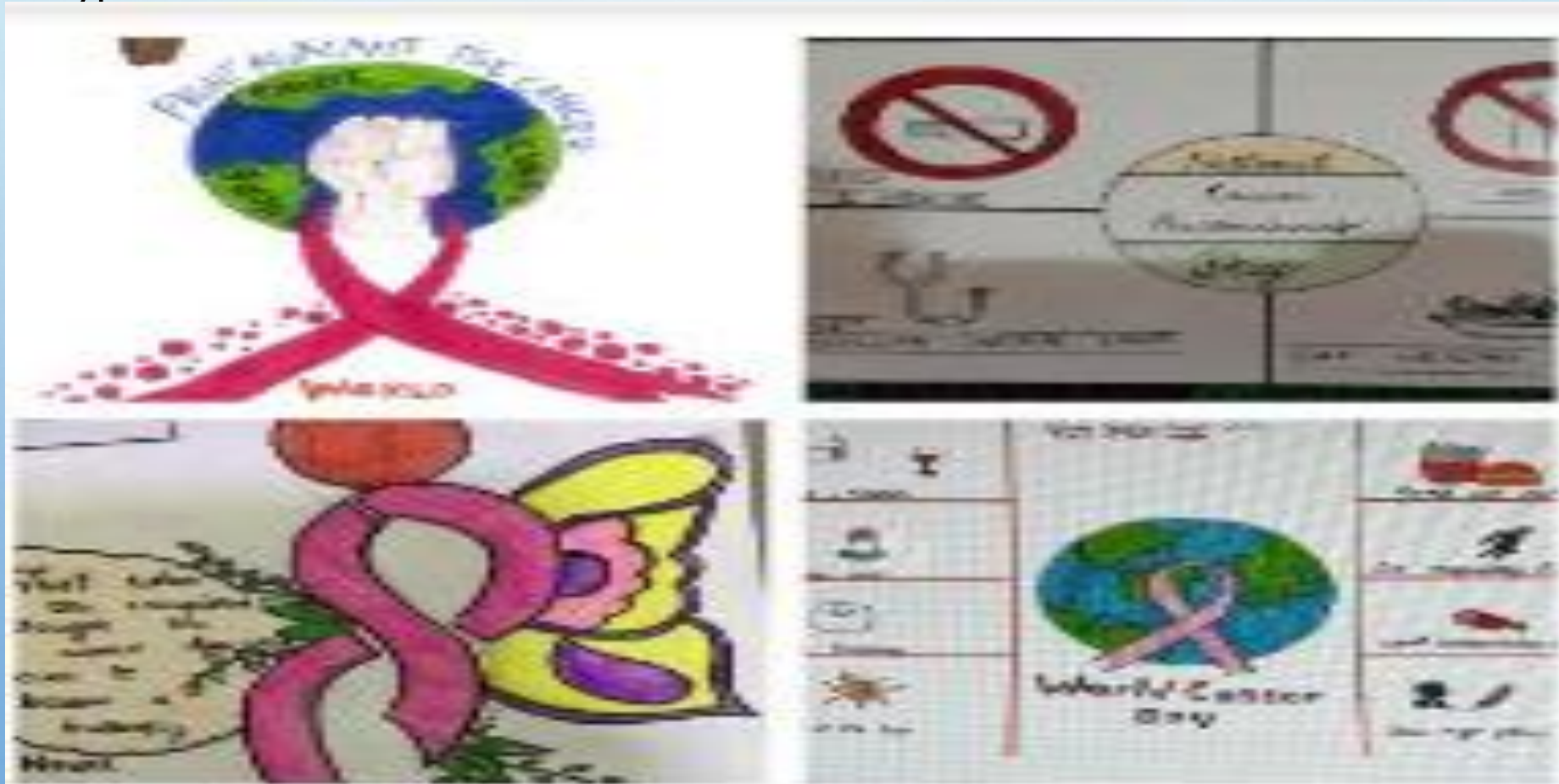
We the students of UIIS had conducted an activity to prepare a scrapbook – on the places they had visited with their family.

A bouquet Making activity was held for these classes, allowing the students to display their artistic talent in an enjoyable environment. Surprisingly they were able to

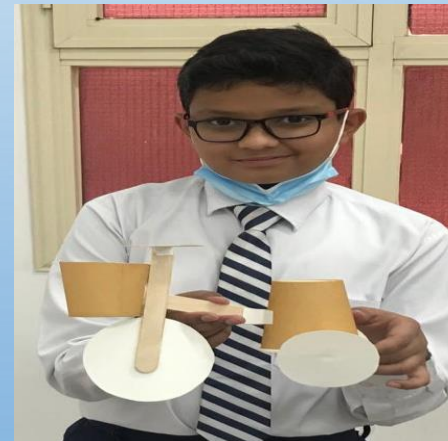
put out innovative ideas and make beautiful flowers with a limited number of resources.

The amount of effort and the presence of mind the students showed during the activity was impressive, and resulted in an array of breathtaking pieces of craft.



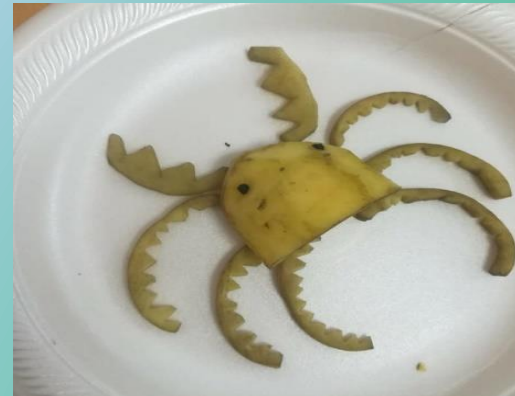

"He who has health has hope; and he who has hope has everything."

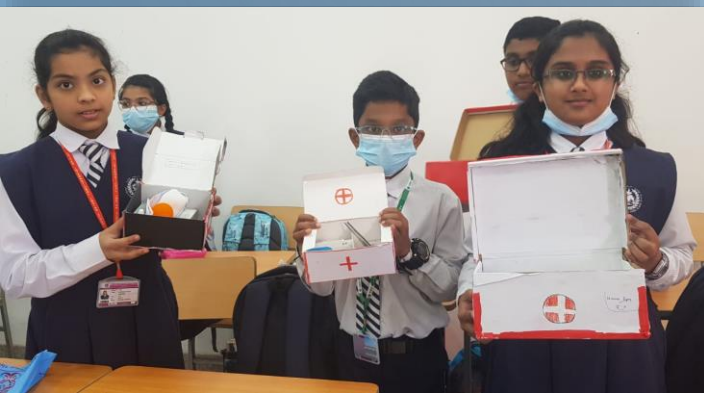
